Hi Webelos and Adult Partners!

Welcome to the **Chief Black Dog (GO!) District** Annual Webelos Woods. **“Be Prepared”** for a weekend of Scouting adventure, skill learning and most of all **fun!** This Webelos Woods Participant Guidebook tells you what it is about and how to be ready to enjoy the experience.

WHO: All first year (4th Grade) Webelos in Chief Black Dog and near-by districts, Den Chiefs, plus a minimum number of Boy Scouts, (maximum of two per Webelos den) to serve as patrol and activity leaders, and a minimum of one adult per every two Webelos.

WHAT: Parent - youth overnight camping and outdoor Scouting experience.

WHEN: Friday, May 3 through Sunday, May 5.

WHERE: Phillippo Scout Reservation, near Cannon Falls, MN. Check in at the Warming House (below the sledding hill). Go south on US Highway 52 and continue to Minnesota Highway 19 (Cannon Falls/Northfield). Go west on Minnesota Highway 19 to 310th Street (see sign to Phillippo Scout Reservation). Go north and then west on 310th Street to camp entrance.

WHY: Webelos Woods is an opportunity to expose 4th grade Webelos to Scouts BSA camping methods, and skills under conditions of increased independence and self reliance than a typical den activity provides, all in a Scouts BSA led outdoor camping experience, supervised by adult Scouts BSA leaders, with parents nearby. The program is centered on outdoor Scouting activities and having a fun weekend.

COST: \$15 per youth, \$10 for adult on or before April 24; \$18 per youth, \$13 per adult after April 24.

REGISTRATION/CHECK-IN: Register on-line by May 1 to allow time to plan for staff and food requirements. Check-in will be at the Warming House beginning at 6:00 PM. We have reserved the nearby activity field as campsites for your tents. Campsites will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Webelos Woods activities will begin at 9:00 AM Saturday. See schedule below. Parking is across the road in the large parking lot near the shooting ranges.

FOOD: Foil dinners will be provided for all registered Scouts and adults for the Saturday evening meal. Webelos dens will provide their own food for all other meals. A “brown bag” meal is suggested for Friday evening, or eat on the road. All meals will be prepared in the campsite by the Webelos and adults.

EQUIPMENT: Scouts and Pack are responsible for bringing their own equipment.

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PACK/PATROL EQUIPMENT

Note: If your pack does not have this equipment check with your partner Scout Troop to see if they are able to loan it to you.

Tents, for all Webelos and adults (you will tent separately)	
Waterproof ground cloth	Dishwashing equipment
Cooking gear for each Patrol (6-8) Webelos and adults	
Water containers	Pots and soap for dishwashing and cleanup
First aid kit	Trash bags
Dining Fly (if desired)	Cooler Box and ice- for foil dinners on Saturday
Camp stoves and fuel (Only adults will handle fuel and operate stoves)	

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ARE STRICTLY PROHIBITED ON CAMP PROPERTY. ANY INDIVIDUAL, YOUTH, OR ADULT, IN POSSESSION OF ANY PROHIBITED ITEMS WILL BE ASKED TO LEAVE THE CAMP PREMISES

- Alcoholic beverages of any kind
- Gasoline or propane space heaters
- Sheath knives (only folding pocket knives are allowed)
- Firearms, archery gear or fireworks of any kind

WEBELOS WOODS – SCOUTING SKILLS STATIONS

1. **Knots** – Learn the basic knots for camping:

- Square Knot
- Bowline
- Two half-hitches
- Taut-line hitch
- Whipping and fusing

2. **First Aid** – prevention and cure for common injuries:

- a. Simple cuts and scratches
- b. Blisters on the hand and foot
- c. Minor burns or scalds
- d. Bites or stings of insects and ticks
- e. Poisonous snake bites
- f. Nosebleed
- g. Frostbite and sunburn

3. **Map and Compass** – basic navigation skills:

How a compass works, how to orient a map, what map symbols mean.

4. **Fire Building** – Prepare tinder, kindling and fuel to build a fire. Start a fire and use coals to cook your evening meal . After allowing the fire to burn safely, safely extinguish the flames with minimal impact to the fire site.

5. **Cooking** – Prepare a balanced meal for your den or family; demonstrate an understanding of food safety practices while preparing foil dinners for your den.

6. **Knife, Axe, and Saw** – Proper care and use. Demonstrate your knowledge of the pocketknife safety rules and the pocketknife pledge. If you have not already done so, earn your Whittling Chip card.

7. **Nature Walk and Tree Identification** – Enjoy a walk through the woods and a great view. Identify two different groups of trees, the parts of a tree, four trees common to the area. Tell how wildlife and humans use trees. Identify four plants common to the area. Learn how to care for trees and how this tree helps the environment.

8. **Mystery Activity** – Outdoor Code and Leave No Trace

Tent Pitching –Locating good tent sites, how to set up tents, what to do in case of severe weather

WEBELOS WOODS – Requirements that can be earned:

The Webelos should be able to fulfill all requirements to earn their Camper and Into the Woods adventures and half of the Scouting Adventure and Cast Iron Chef requirements.

We will work on all of the Camper (Outdoorsman) requirements.

We will work on requirements 1 through 4 of the Into the Woods and 5 or 6.

We will work on requirements 4, 5, and 6 of the Scouting Adventure.

We will work on requirements 2, and 3 of the Cast Iron Chef Adventure.

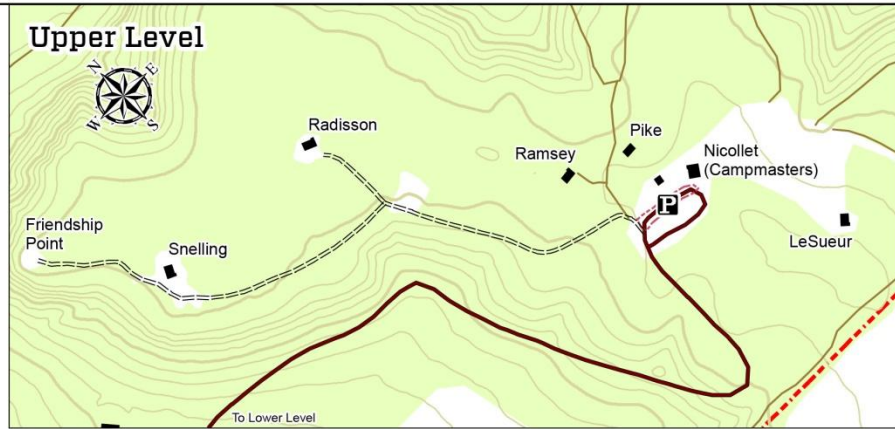
